

QUALIFIED PRACTITIONER DIPLOMA COURSE

For those wishing to train to become a professional Reflexologist:

The course is accredited through The Bayly School of Reflexology Ltd [Worcester] but all classes taught by me are held in Grange, South Lake District. On completion of the coursework all successful students will receive the:

Practitioner Diploma from the Bayly School of Reflexology.

The course format takes into consideration material present in the National Occupational Standards (NOS) for Reflexology and the Core Curriculum for Reflexology of CNHC (Complementary and Natural Healthcare Council). The qualification offered is a private one though equivalent to those available for Reflexology at level 3 on the Regulated Qualifications Framework (RQF).

What is included in the course?:

- 7 x 2-Day weekends [midweek on request]
- All theory & practical tuition
- Examination Day fees
- Student membership
- Online support throughout the duration of the coursework
- Access to becoming a member of the CNHC
- Access to becoming a member of The British Reflexology Association
- Guidance with Insurance once qualified

Attendance is required for 7 modules over 1 year or less, a module being a 2-day course, mainly weekends. Each module is made up of morning lecture sessions and afternoon practical sessions with short refreshment breaks / lunch during the day. The days normally run from 9.30am to 5.30pm. 7 modules totals 100 hours attendance.

Lecture mornings consist of A&P theory & note-taking, learning the reflexes of the feet in stages. For the afternoon practical sessions, students will observe demonstrations of a reflexology treatment & give supervised treatments to other students and on some occasions to other people invited to attend to receive treatment from the students who are training.

The first module [Introduction to Reflexology] is not assessed but does include portfolio-building & observations, repeating techniques shown & understanding the anatomy of the foot. Modules 2-7 include A&P in the classroom, online A&P short course at home, the systems of the body with small classroom tests, preparation of the treatment room, consultation sheets, conditions clients attend with, case-studies in-class & at home. You will complete 100 hours of treatments will need to be completed throughout the course and a full explanation of the case work will be given at the course. It involves case studies (56 hours) and individual treatments (44 hours).

Assessments:

- **portfolio-building**
- **observations / repeating techniques**
- **A&P short tests in-class**
- **A&P online coursework**
- **practical**
- **case-studies**

Examination Day - on completion of the full diploma coursework an Examination Day may be attended at which a written and a practical test are taken and students successful in these tests are awarded the Diploma & will be allowed to practise thereafter.

The first module of the Diploma is the same syllabus as The Introductory Weekends, only Diploma students stay on till 5.30pm. This is to include another practical treatment. Modules 2-7 are a separate syllabus altogether.

PAYMENT:

Total cost of the Diploma : £1900

You can pay the whole balance in one go or you can pay the deposit of £250 which covers Module 1. Then we can arrange a payment plan via email to cover the rest of the modules and tuition. All Diploma students will be sent a list of dates for modules 2-7 as they are not on the website.

TO BOOK:

Either payment of the whole amount or the deposit payment will automatically register you onto the **first module** .This will be module 1 of 7. The rest of the Diploma modules 2-7 can be attended whenever is convenient for you and will be arranged via email. Each module [2 days] will include the necessary hours & theory & practice required to add to your Diploma hours

Email contact & support from your tutor is available in between each module whenever it is required.
